There is no cost to Montana teachers for this workshop which includes an option for continuing education units from the Montana Office of Public Instruction.



Workshop Goals

- Prairie immersion – spend time in this unique landscape
- Learn more about prairie plants, animals, systems, as well as methods and resources for teaching about these in your classroom
- Learn from scientists currently studying the ecosystem
- Tour the National Discovery Center – a new educational exhibit in Lewistown, MT
- Network and collaborate with teachers from all over Montana

The workshop will be based out of the picturesque Antelope Creek Campground 73 miles north of Lewistown on Hwy. 191. The campground is equipped with four cabins as well as tent and RV sites. There is also a beautiful shower house including bathrooms. Catered meals will be provided. Sessions will be held outdoors along a two mile interpretive trail or in an onsite climate controlled classroom.

Educators will first meet up and tour the National Discovery Center in downtown Lewistown before heading out to Antelope Creek Campground. Mileage costs to and from the campground will be reimbursed.
